WORDPRESS AS AN APPLICATION PLATFORM

BUT WHY?

- allows you to integrate data + features from WordPress into any application
 - build static sites/apps that just pull data in via ajax
 - use WordPress as your data storage
 - ► json RESTful API
- works with any language/platform as long as it can make HTTP requests

WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS?

JSON-API PLUGIN

- Established the longest amount of time
- Well maintained but just a single plugin author
 - Relies on a plugin
 - ► Easiest to setup for basic requests
- ► No authentication provided, relies on login cookies

WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH THE JSON-API?

- ► Add along ?json=1 to any URL to obtain the results in JSON
- ► GET site info, posts, taxonomies, authors, comments, widgets,
 - ► Expandable via hooks and filters

WP-API

- Backed by the core team
- Scheduled for release in core in WordPress 4.1
 - Great infrastructure already
 - **▶** WP CLI
- ► No real world/large scale implementations yet
 - Uses cookies or oauth1 for authentication

WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH THE WP-API?

- Retrieve and create/update site info, posts, users, taxonomies, comments, post meta, revisions, media
 - ► Truly restful (uses GET, POST, PUT, DELETE)
 - ▶ Typical route is /wp-json/**object**/**id**
 - Expandable via hooks and filters

ROLL YOUR OWN

- By far the most flexible, but likely the most work
- Probably not re-usable and will require maintenance
- WordPress has a ton of helper functions to make this easy
 - Authentication may or may not be straightfoward
 - ► You can run any query/any functions

WORDPRESS.COM / JETPACK API

- works with WordPress.com and Jetpack-enabled WP.org blogs (since 1.9+! now at 3.1.1)
 - uses oauth2 for authentication
 - insights/stats into your own app usage
 - many real world implementations out there
 - most mature and complete API

WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH THE JETPACK API?

- user info, site info
- create, edit, delete, find, reblog, and view posts (includes CPTs, post meta & media)
 - reate, edit, delete, find, and view comments
 - search & related posts
 - taxonomies (categories/tags & custom ones too)

WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH THE JETPACK API?

- ► likes & following/subscribing to a blog
- WordPress.com Freshly Pressed content
 - notifications
 - stats
 - WordPress.com reader
 - your own app's insights
